This article is in reference to much discussion of the Emmaus Board in regard to keeping the Darke County Area Emmaus Community active and the continuing of future walks in making disciples of Jesus Christ. Since the covid-19 pandemic, the activities have been put pretty much on hold with the closing of many churches.

With God still in the business of answering the prayers of his people. He has opened some doors for the community to continue to function in having future walks.

A few months ago, the board sought to seek other facilities to have future walk. While some facilities did not, or could not, want to commit to any obligations due to the unknown future regarding the pandemic conditions.

However, there was one facility that was willing to open its doors to the idea of a future home to the Community. Having walks as well as team meetings and that being the Ludlow Falls Camp located on State Route 48 in Ludlow Falls.

A committee, with the approval of the board, was set up to visit the camp and it was completed on November 25, 2020. The visit was very good and the facilities would very much meet the needs of the community for future walks. There would be no need for air mattresses as all beds are bunks with mattresses. Pilgrims and team members could sleep on the bottom bunk and use the top bunk for personal items. There are many showers and restroom facilities available. The cost would be kept in line with what the cost has been in the past at other facilities.

MORE THAN CONQUERORS

As we close one year and open another, my mind is going in many directions. There is one verse that continually settles in my mind as I ponder the happenings of 2020. "In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." -Romans 8:37. As we enter 2021, do you feel like a conqueror? How about MORE than a conqueror? 2020 did indeed hold many new things for us as individuals, communities, churches, and a nation. We have faced things that we never imagined that we would need to deal with. Many have dealt with sickness, death, and financial trials. Uncertainty has been a common reality to many of us. Nothing seems to be set in stone any longer. Life as we have as we have known and relied on in the past is constantly changing and we struggle to keep up with those changes. Fear lingers on the fringes of many of our minds, and sometimes even comes in and attempts to take up residence. We have no idea of how to wade through with all this unchartered territory. We know in our minds that, as Christians, we should be leading the way, with the banner of Christ held high, and yet, we feel so confused and lost. Going to Romans 8:35, we read a list of things that we are told cannot separate us from the love of God. How close does His love feel to you right now? Do you see the events of 2020 pulling you away from your relationship with Jesus? Is He still your focus? There are many voices around us tempting us to focus on the negative things that have happened in the last twelve months. We expect negativity to be heralded from the world, but how disappointing is it to find the same focus on Christian radio, in too many conversations, and even in numerous sermons, where we also find the focus on the negative events. I freely acknowledge that I have not been deeply affected by sickness, death, or financial trials in the last year like many have been (or are going) through. I do, however, have a deep burden in my heart that we do not lose our hope that is found in Jesus Christ alone. God has informed us that this life will not be easy (see 1 Peter 4:12, John 16:33, and 1 Peter 5:10). We follow the One who lived a very hard life while here on this earth. In Philippians 2:1-11, we find what His mind was set on as He went through trail after trial. Jesus has never promised us an easy life. Having His blessings does not mean that we have a perfect, trial-free life here. If that were true for us, would we long for Heaven? No, I dare say that we would be perfectly content here, in this life. God, our perfect Father, has placed each one of us in this time, for the purpose of sharing Him with a world that is instilling fear deep into the hearts of mankind. We, as American Christians, have had relatively easy lives. We have each had our individual trials. Our faith has been tested in various ways individually. We have, however, never been through an event that has challenged our corporate faith in the way this year has. How, then, can we be more than conquerors? How can we enter 2021 in victory? I believe one part of that can be found in verse 6 of Romans 8: "... For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace." We need to keep our focus on Jesus and His work through the Holy Spirit in us. While the world would have us focused on the things that are completely out of our control, Paul calls us here to make the choice to set our minds on the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' death and resurrection has delivered us from that power, and gives us peace, despite the unknown territory that He leads us into. The Holy Spirit is the power in us which the world cannot overcome. We can live from that victory and in that power. We are not under the power of the world. We are free to walk in freedom, sharing the way to freedom with each person we come into contact with in this life. My prayer for each of you for 2021 is that you will come closer to Jesus, be surrendered to the Holy Spirit, and be one who spreads hope in the chaos of this world.
