Here are a few guidelines to follow for writing and making agape:

#1 Please put your name on your agape and on agape containers/bags, leftovers will be available to pick up at the closing of the weekend and for 2 gatherings afterward. Whatever hasn't been claimed after that will be donated to the Chrysalis community.

#2 NO PERSONAL AGAPE for pilgrims until Sunday for their packets. This can be only letters, notes and cards, or whatever will fit into an envelope. No large agape will be accepted such as mugs, t-shirts, framed pictures or books, please give these items to them after their walk. Agape can be no larger than what will fit into a 9"x12" manila envelope.

#3 Team and pilgrim agape must have first and last name on the front of the envelope. And for team agape it also must have the day you want them to receive it or it will be put in the Sunday packet. There have been times when we have had more than one person with the same first name and your agape could go to the wrong person.

Loyalty to a person or thing; allegiance. **4**. Often **Faith**. *Theol*. The theological virtue defined as secure belief in God and a trusting acceptance of God's will.

This is the definition of faith that can be found in the American Heritage College Dictionary. This is what we often think of when we consider faith. This makes faith seem pretty simple, fairly easy to obtain. This gives a nice little answer to the question, "What is faith?" While this gives us a little piece of what faith is, I believe that faith is so much more than what we can find explained in a dictionary. Faith includes knowledge. And knowledge includes faith. As confusing as this seems, you can't have one without the other. When doing math, you need to have faith that simple addition really works. Through reali-

ty, you have been convicted that addition is fact (you have this knowledge). This principle then gives you the knowledge to go on into deeper math. There are so many set laws in our lives that we have faith in. Most often we don't even stop to think of these laws. We just have faith in them. Math is one. Gravity is another. We can't see gravity, but we understand it enough to believe that it exists.

Knowledge and faith go hand in hand but

you cannot gain spiritual faith through knowledge. God alone reveals knowledge of Himself and His ways. After He gives us knowledge of Himself, it then becomes our responsibility to respond to that revelation by having faith in Him.

There is an element of faith that is intellectual, but faith is so much more than reaching a certain amount of knowledge. Faith has results, as we can clearly see in Hebrews 11. There are various and different ways that faith is displayed in the lives of true believers, but ultimately it is the practical submission of the entire being to the guidance and control of Truth as God makes Himself known to us. So, we can see that we cannot have faith in God until He reveals truth

These are just a few random thoughts on a very deep and wide subject. I pray this will stir up deeper thoughts and convictions as you grow in the faith of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Some Words from our Men's Good Shepherd—Jeff Feitshans

I was shivering in the large, cold, empty, building. The wind was brutally cold coming off the lake in early February of 1980. I was dressed in a t-shirt, shorts, and tennis shoes, as were the other 70 young men. We were in Great Lakes, Michigan, just beginning our journey through 2 months of boot camp in the United States Navy. The reason for our being in the large building was to run. Our company commander flatly told us we all were going to run several miles together. I began to panic, realizing I had never run even one mile before in my life. How in the world was this going to happen?

The commander blew the loud whistle. Like a train, our group slowly started moving. As we entered a quick jog, it took a few minutes to find our pace. Then I heard it - the cadence of our footsteps – clop, clop, clop, clop. I matched my own pace to that sound – clop, clop, clop. Very quickly the sound became mesmerizing. My attention was fixated on that repetitive sound. We ran. And we ran. I remember two of the men were falling behind. A few of us nearby tried to help by encouraging them, getting ahold of their arms, and shouting, "C'mon! You can do this!"

Eventually, the company commander blew the whistle again, signaling for us to stop running. He informed us we had run the required distance and would be here the next morning to do it again. I must admit, that caught me by surprise. We all ran, together, as one unit for several miles.

The point of this story, as I'm sure you've guessed, is the incredible things we can accomplish as a unified team. God designed us to work together, to live together, to function together as one body. Oftentimes, we imagine we'll go it alone. But our best efforts, while noble, cannot reach the heights of what we can do together.

The upcoming men's walk planned for April 15th-18th will require us to work together as one body, one team. Only God knows what can really happen if we set our minds to this. Following the walk, then we'll understand the strength and power of the Emmaus Community in a refreshing way. It could potentially spark the fire we long to see once again. I challenge you to consider how God is asking you to participate. This could prove to be something of a modern-day miracle! We will never know until we match our pace to the clop, clop, clop of the Holy Spirit's cadence.
