### The Rains

As I awoke this morning to the sound of rain on the roof, I immediately felt joy. Our ground had become extremely dry and the crops were showing that fact. As I continued to lie in my bed and enjoy that melodious sound, part of a verse came to mind. "For He... sends rain on the just and on the unjust." (Matthew 5:45) Have you ever thought about how the farmer prays earnestly for rain because his crops are in need and, all the while, a young bride begs for the rains to hold off so that she can have her perfect outside wedding? One prays for a dry week of vacation so that hiking is safer while another asks for rain so the rapids are a bit livelier and the rivers a bit fuller for their rafting trip. Is one just and the other unjust? We cannot say, but God pours out His mercy on both. Is this not a sign of the goodness of the Lord? The rains come, and the rains go, but the Lord remains faithful through it all. Blessings come, and blessings go, but the Lord remains faithful. Just this week, I have been wrestling with several things and felt like I was losing on every side. And the winds. The blessings are in His hand to do with as He pleases. We are called to look for the blessings in both the drought and the rainy season. And may we, along with Job, say, "The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21) Let's dance in the rain and dance through the drought, trusting that with whatever the Lord brings into our lives, He will glorify Himself. Our hope is not in the rain or in the drought, but in the Lord Jesus alone.



We have a few board positions open that need a servant heart to fill. (A board position is a 3 year term)

\*\*All positions require attending regular monthly board meetings.

#### We need:

\*Social—coordinate a team to set up for send off dinner on walk weekends and set up/tear down for monthly gatherings among other things

### Openings as of December 31, 2022

- \*Agape—set up and tear down of Agape room for walk weekends, collecting and distributing Agape on walk weekends.
- \*Newsletter—collect articles and design newsletter and email it out 6 times a year. Collect and enter email addresses from new community members and others in the community who would like to receive the newsletter. Post the newsletter on the FaceBook page.
- \*Chrysalis—represent Darke County Emmaus Community on the Western Ohio Chrysalis board. Keep both communities informed of walks and gatherings and serving opportunities.
- \*Music—Todd Matthew has been an excellent music chair several years now but he would like to hand it off to someone else. You can ask Todd for the job description for this position.
